

Towards Revitalizing Muslim Forum

he current executive council of the Bayero University, Kano Muslim Forum, under the leadership of Professor Musa Muhammad Borodo, was inaugurated on Saturday 21st February, 2016 to steer the affairs of the forum for two years. Since the inauguration, the executive committee has made efforts toward ensuring the continued existence of the forum and achieving its objectives.

The first decision by the executive committee, to give a new lease of life to the forum, was to ensure frequent meetings by the members which resulted into adoption of key resolutions toward revitalization of the forum's activities. The meetings led to the formation of subcommittees to provide more guidance on the revitalization of the forum. Most of the committees have submitted their reports and implementation has commenced.

Re-introduction of public lectures like the one conducted during the last Ramadan, the Muslim Forum's leaflet recently circulated (which carries brief about the forum, its financial status, some projects executed and other important up to date

information) and redesigned staff monthly contribution forms currently circulating are some of the decisions suggested by the sub-committees. To cap it all, the executive members constituted extended 11-member an advisory committee headed by Professor Shehu Aliyu Rano. The advisory committee has also submitted its report and some of its decisions are being implemented by the executive committee.

One of the key suggestions of the Rano's committee was the reintroduction of this newsletter which will Insha Allah be published and circulated on quarterly basis. The newsletter, which has new serialization, is aimed at updating the University community on the activities of the forum, University Mosques Committee as well as other important events unfolding, in and around the University.

As the current leadership of the forum set to implement its agenda for the development of the University Muslim community, it is hope that the community will, Insha Allah, reap from their sacrifices and contributions to the success of the forum, here and in the hereafter.

EDITORIAL

For the Plight of IDPs

he effort made by members of Kano Coalition of Ulama and Civil Societies under their project code named "NUSA'ID" that visited Borno state and donated relief items to Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) at various camps in November last year is worthy of commendation.

There are over a million displaced persons in the North Eastern states as a result of Boko Haram insurgency and media reports indicate that they are living in terrible conditions in the camps and host communities. Men, women and children are living in hunger and starvation. Many IDPs have only sky as their roof; water, clothing and healthcare have become a mirage in some of their locations.

As a result of the difficult situation of the IDPs, members of the NUSA'ID mobilized the University Community and other philanthropists in the state to donate clothes, food and money for the IDPs via various Juma'at Mosques or through Kano Council of Ulama JAIZ Bank Account (000 0024 550).

The donors responded positively and members of the NUSA'ID team, under the leadership of Prof. Musa Muhammad Borodo, paid a 2-week visit to Maiduguri where they delivered 10 trailer loads of relief materials worth N200,000,000 made up of 25,260 specially prepared 5kg bags containing rice, spaghetti, garri, and other foodstuff; 4,500 packs of Action Meal in special 3Kg bags; in addition to more than 53,680 packets containing two pairs each of clothing materials. These items were distributed to the IDPs at Bakassi, Dalori, Rehabilitation Centre, Muna Garage, Elmiskeen, Madinatu, Gwange, Indimi, CĂN Centre and other camps and host communities.

This effort made by members of the NUSA'ID team and the contributors (both from within and outside the University community) is something worthy of commendation and emulation. Islam calls for good neighborliness and believers have been likened to a single body in their mercy, compassion and love for one another. The NUSA'ID team and the donors have commendably demonstrated love, care and concern of brotherhood by organizing the contribution and going to Maiduguri to present the donations. The Muslim Ummah needs more of these efforts.

The Muslim Forum is hereby making a clarion call to members of the University Community not to relent on this good initiative and to the philanthropists and public spirited Muslims globally to come to the aid of the impoverished IDPs in various camps across the country.

To deny the IDPs our succor and sympathy will certainly be unjustifiable. Humanitarian responsibility is a civic duty not only meant for wiping anguish off the faces of the afflicted, but a divine charter and the guarantee for a society that wants to be at peace with itself.

He said: "The objective of the fund is to, among others, support the education of the children of deceased members of the ASUU-BUK branch from primary school to university level; assist members of the Union who are diagnosed critically ill and may require special and expensive medical treatment within or outside the country and to provide educational support for other children of the members who are alive but are out of job due to permanent disability".

He said the fund had given educational assistance to children of deceased members and assisted members who were diagnosed with critical ailments. Dr. Darma said the ASUU-BUK PTF was a contributory welfare charity for all paying members of the union.

On his part, Head of Mass Communication Department, Dr. Suleiman M. Yar'Adua, said: "The accreditation experience was highly motivating and encouraging because it gives us a lot of hope into the future".

Also commenting on the exercise, the Dean, Faculty of Communication, Professor Umar Pate commended the University Management for its commitment towards ensuring that the institution met the accreditation requirements.
